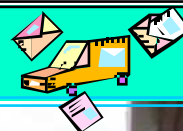

Anzac Biscuits

2 cups of rolled oats
1 cup plain flour
1/2 cup melted butter

1/2 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon cream of tartar
1 tablespoon Golden Syrup

1 cup coconut
1/2 teaspoon carb soda
4 tablespoons boiling water

Method:

Dissolve carb soda in water. Mix dry ingredients in bowl, then add syrup, then water soda and melted butter.

Place teaspoons full of mixture on greased tray about 5cm apart.

Bake in a slow oven of 150-160° for 15-20 minutes. Check biscuits while cooking as different ovens vary cooking time. Cool a few minutes on a wire rack.

CFS REPORT APRIL 2011



Incident Report

This year's weather has certainly made things difficult to predict what may affect us. One week the CFS is chasing a grass fire started by slashing grass, which then caused a tractor fire. The next week the OTH CFS was providing four vehicles to assist with multiple flooding/salvage emergency calls in the northern areas. Currently the call out rate is above last year's comparable rate.

The One Tree Hill CFS Brigade reminds all residents of the One Tree Hill and surrounding areas that the Brigade has no input into any decisions that are made in regard to Building Approvals, we are not consulted in any way. This service is provided by CFS Headquarters.

Councillor's Report

Council has ruled out for now, the option of a differential rating system, elected members felt it was unfair to single out certain sections of the community for special treatment at the exclusion of others. It now appears that council will work on a ratio system to determine borrowings, debt and interest repayments. Borrowings will be between 10 – 30% of our disposable assets value i.e. 1 billion dollars of saleable assets allows 100 to 300 million Dollars in borrowings with a 10% cap on interest repayments this of course will impact on rating levels and councils ability to enhance and or deliver new services. It also means that council will have perpetual debt.

Three self funded Development Plan Amendments are soon to be lodged with council resulting into a substantial area of Playford being targeted for rezoning; Angle Vale and Virginia are under consideration as are parts of Munno Para.

Anzac Day is fast approaching and I have again volunteered to represent our Mayor as he will be unable to attend due to other obligations he cannot get out of, at least not without a divorce. I hope to see many of you there on the morning Progress does a fantastic job in organising this event.

Due to the need to have the Draft City Plan ready for public consultation another Saturday morning Strategic Council meeting has been organised for Saturday the 2nd of April, I will report on the outcome. Some council meetings are also commencing at 6.00pm an hour earlier to give us more time to catch up with City Plan business.

Please read the section regarding the Disability Discrimination Act Reference committee and if it is of interest to you please consider joining.

However I cannot guarantee that I will be able to get any better results but will at least have council reassess their position and provide an explanation as to their resolve and in some cases reach a compromise that is acceptable to all parties concerned.

Making it Easier to Find Lost Super

Federal Member for Wakefield Nick Champion has welcomed a Government announcement which will help Australians find their 'lost' superannuation after the release of draft legislation that will allow superannuation funds to use tax file numbers (TFNs) to identify members' accounts.

An estimated 5.8 million super accounts, or about one in five, are lost – an average of one lost account for every two working Australians. The total amount of lost superannuation is \$18.8 billion.

Mr Champion said this announcement honoured an election commitment the government made and will help more Australians track down their superannuation.

The draft Bill enables superannuation funds to use the TFN to identify member accounts from 1 July 2011.

Although members can currently supply their TFN to their fund, it cannot be used as the primary identifier of their accounts or to assist with consolidation of accounts between and across funds.

The proposal will be subject to strict privacy guidelines.

Changes to Water Saving Device

Changes to Water Saving Device Minister for Water Paul Caica is advising South Australians of the opportunity to claim rebates on some water efficient products under the State Government's H₂OME Rebate Scheme which is ending soon.

The community has until March 31 to purchase dual flush toilets, pool covers and rollers, hot water re-circulators, water efficient showerheads or request a home water audit and submit their claim to SA Water by May 31.

Rainwater tanks that are plumbed into the home need to be purchased before June 30 and the rebate claimed by August 31.

"Rebates for a standalone rainwater tank, garden goods and the residential retrofit program will continue to ensure the community can make their homes more water efficient," he said.

"Homeowners can claim \$200 on a standalone rainwater tank, up to \$200 on a range of water efficient garden goods or spend \$30 to have a licensed plumber check the water efficiency of their home and install water saving devices."

I thought everyone may be interested in my method of getting millipedes under control. I sprinkle BAYSOL snail & slug bait out on the ground under a light at night and leave the light on over night. I will often have many thousands of dead millipedes there the next morning. It is then just a matter of sweeping them up and doing the same thing the next night. Eventually the numbers reduce and everyone is happy. Make sure that dogs can't get to this area as the snail bait is poisonous to them. Only use BAYSOL as the other snail baits don't seem to work. 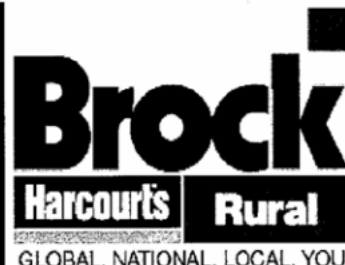

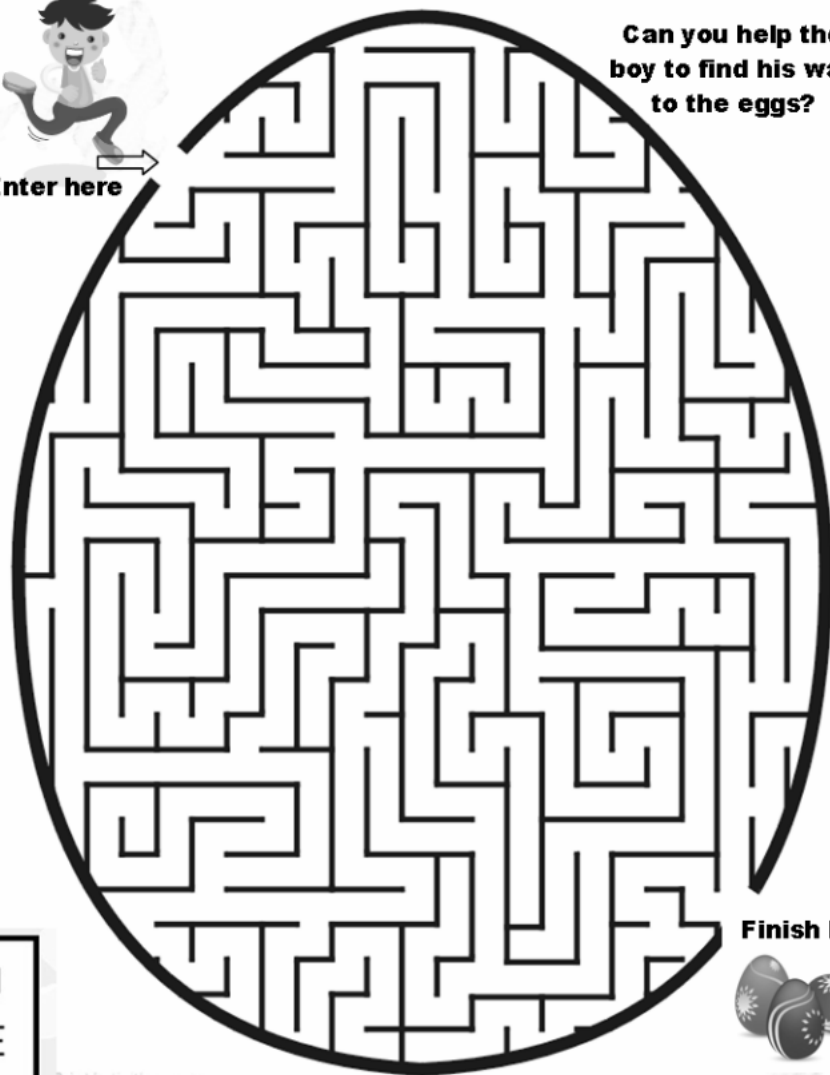

Horse Care - Feeding for Good Hooves



Brittle hooves, common in Thoroughbreds, can be managed by supplementing with certain nutrients. Biotin (vitamin H) at a rate of 15mg per day has been shown to improve hoof wall quality.

Calcium and protein must also be provided in suitable amounts and forms. Soy meal (preferably as full fat soy), copra, linseed, and beans are the most common and useful for horses. Soy is the most balanced of protein oils, while others need supplements or mixing. But all oils must be fresh as they go rancid in a few months, reducing acceptability. The raw forms of all oil seed cannot be fed safely. They need to be processed, either by manufacturers or by you cooking. In many forms, you will need to add additional supplements to balance adverse effects of cooking. Some release toxins in the gut which must be neutralised by cooking correctly prior to feeding. Lucerne is a good source of both calcium and protein but some extra protein may need to be fed. An excess of calcium may bind magnesium.

There are several hoof supplements on the market. You may need to add protein.

Hooves grow from the coronet band in about 6 months. You will see a line move down the hoof as the supplementation takes effect.

Medical Alert



March 18th 2011 - Latin Seed Slimming Products

Government testing has identified the *The Latin Seed* slimming product contains the toxic *Thevetia nerifolia* or *Thevetia peruviana* (otherwise known as yellow oleander, lucky nut or the 'be still tree') not Candle Nut (*Aleurites moluccana*) as declared on the label. *Thevetia nerifolia* or *Thevetia peruviana* contain various cardiac glycosides which can produce a digoxin-like action on the heart (with a variety of arrhythmias) and cause severe gastrointestinal irritation. Reports have been received (in Victoria and NSW) of people having severe diarrhoea and gastrointestinal complaints associated with the consumption of *The Latin Seed*. There are currently no data to indicate the concentration(s) of the various cardiac glycosides from these products. *Thevetia nerifolia* or *Thevetia peruviana* are prohibited for use in food products in Australia due to their toxicity. *The Latin Seed* slimming product has been recalled from sale in Australia. Anyone who may have consumed this product and feels unwell is being advised to seek immediate medical advice.

Product Description and Distribution: The Latin Seed product is marketed as being 100% Brazilian candle nut. Marketing of the product utilises the internet, broadcast and print media. The product can be purchased in retail outlets such as health food stores, beauty salons, dress shops and fitness centres or may have been purchased directly via the internet. It has been distributed in South Australia.

News from the One Tree Hill Primary School

There has been considerable discussion in the media in recent weeks about the information released on the myschool website. (www.myschool.edu.au). Information on this site reflects the significant growth made by our school over recent years in comparison with students in like schools and with all students across Australia. It is worth a visit to the site to check out our school's achievements as well as other information presented.

While the NAPLAN tests are just one aspect of the assessment procedures used at our school they do reflect the considerable gains made in all areas of testing and across all year levels. We acknowledge that there are still areas for us to continue to grow and develop and we shall be maintaining our relentless focus on learning, particularly in Literacy and Comprehension. We must also acknowledge other aspects of our school that we do well: such as caring for student and staff well being, catering for individual academic and social learning needs which are not necessarily reflected in NAPLAN results.

For those who are interested in statistics I have a table which shows our results in comparison with like school across Australia. Unfortunately The Grapevine does not have the room to show the table but if you would like a copy please email the school.

It is timely to acknowledge the hard work put in by our students, their teachers, past and present, Dawn, our Literacy Coach, School Service Officers who support our learning programmes and our parents in supporting their learning.

Pioneer Women - "A woman's work was never done"

How true of our pioneering women! As well as helping with the farmwork, she was expected to look after the cows, pigs, garden and the numerous children, sew and darn their clothing, bake the bread, and cook meals with help from her daughters as they got older. "I wonder what they did in their spare time?"

There was little money, they grew most of their food needs, fowls provided eggs, which were often taken to the store - up to 40 miles away, and exchanged for groceries. When egg laying days were over, the fowls were boiled and provided variety in the diet, as well as chicken noodle soup. Cows were milked twice a day, the milk set in shallow dishes to allow the cream to rise, then skimmed and churned into butter which was also sold.

The families usually ate lard and dripping, spread over homemade bread. Some of the milk was used to make "Quark" and "Stinkerhase" - cottage cheese; some for daily use and any surplus, together with scraps from the table, fed to the pigs. During the winter months, the fattened pigs with a beef animal were killed, the hams and bacon were cut off, thoroughly salted and left to cure in a wooden cask of brine, then smoked, and stored in the cellar. Some meat was used fresh, the rest was pickled. Sausages, mettwurst, blutwurst and beleberwurst were also made and either stored in the cellar or hung from the rafters; trotters and the head of the pig with some beef were made into brawn. Fat from both animals was rendered down into lard and dripping. The pig fat was cut into cubes, boiled in a large pan until it liquefied, put through a fine strainer and whatever was left in the sieve was cooled and then put through the mincer. This minced mass was called "Griebe" and delicious when spread on bread. Nothing was wasted except the pig's squeal!

Another task was soap making, this was made by adding caustic soda and powdered resin to tallow from the animals killed for food. The tallow was boiled in a kerosene tin over the open fire until it became a thick liquid, the resin and caustic soda were added, stirred into the mixture and poured into flat containers. When it was set, the soap was cut to a useable size, then left to harden. The soap was used to wash themselves, their clothes, dishes and floors unless the floors were hard earth! The toilet (red back spider variety) was built some distance from the house, down through the garden about 400 yards away and usually covered by a creeper of some kind. Toilet paper, from the local newspaper cut into squares by the children, was hung by a string on a nail behind the door. A kerosene tin filled with wood ash, which was sprinkled into the pit, stood near the seat.

Many varieties of fruit trees were grown to supply fresh fruit, some for sale and any surplus made into preserves, jams and wine. The vegetable garden was usually extensive, supplying potatoes, onions, garlic, cabbage, cucumbers and tomatoes. Pickles and relish were made in season and stored in the cellar.

The babies were born at home, with a midwife in attendance, as doctors were few and far between. Homeopathic medicine was the order of the day; soap and sugar plasters to remove splinters, spirits of turps to 'scatter' a boil, eucalyptus on sugar for a sore throat or cold were among some of the treatments. Salt was used in many and varied ways - to remove oil stains, rub in wet salt, as a gargle for sore throats, heated salt pack for toothache. Also salt was used to clean suits and other Hard-to-wash items - just sprinkle over the suit, rub in, shake off and brush thoroughly. A muslin bag soaked in vinegar was used to pop fresh meat into and hung - flies won't land on the bag.

+++++ Worming & Vaccination of Poultry - by Mark of the Fodder Store

A bird's failure to grow or to put on weight as well as expected in the presence of adequate quantity and quality of feed could indicate that your bird is suffering from an infestation of worms (intestinal parasites). A small number of worms might not cause any real problems or even be noticeable but large infestations can cause poor egg production, difficulties maintaining or gaining weight and in extreme cases lead to the death of your bird.

There are several types of worms that can infest your poultry, large round worms, tapeworms, cecal worms, hair worms and gapeworms are to mention a few. Most of these worms are transferred from bird to bird through bird droppings that contain the worm eggs. Poultry can also pick up these parasites through consuming earthworms, grasshoppers and snails etc.

There are a lot of worming treatments around, some of which can target several types of worms and some are more specific in their use. Whatever treatment you use please read the instructions carefully as there could be a withholding period after the use of the treatment before your poultry or their eggs can be consumed by humans. As with horses and other animals, the worms inside poultry can build up immunity to a regularly used treatment so it pays to rotate types of treatments from time to time. If you want to try a suggested natural remedy for your chickens you may wish to give garlic a go. Try adding half a dozen crushed cloves to half a cup of COLD water and let it stand for about eight hours. Shake the solution and then strain it. You can use a dropper to feed direct to the chicken or alternatively you could add the half a cup of solution to about 18 litres of water and give it to your chickens as their only water source for about a week.

If you consider that the incubation period for most worm eggs is about 10 days you will see why it is important to do follow-up treatments before you finally have any hope of breaking the worm breeding cycle. If you allow your birds to scratch around in the garden to find snails, slugs, millipedes and beetles etc (like I do) then there is always the likelihood that they will pick up a parasite or two along the way and then the cycle starts all over again.

VACCINATION OF POULTRY

Just a quick word on vaccination of poultry - We have been asked about vaccination of poultry lately and so did a little research on the subject, as poultry vaccinations are not something that we carry at our shop. General consensus seems to be that it is a very expensive and wasteful exercise to do for the backyard poultry keepers and hobbyists. The reason for this is that many of the vaccinations that are brought in to the county are in large doses where hundreds and in many cases, thousands of birds are vaccinated at the same time. If the average back-yarder has only ten, twenty or even fifty birds to treat, the vaccinations tend to be cost prohibitive. The shelf life of these vaccinations is often very short and some of the products are that temperamental that they are transported and stored in liquid nitrogen canisters. There are several diseases that poultry can be vaccinated against and the big poultry breeders tend to carry out vaccinations for the most common types e.g., Marek's Disease. For the hobbyist, prevention by isolation is perhaps the most economical alternative idea. Be careful when introducing new birds to your flock and try to prevent wild birds from coming in contact with them and their feed areas.

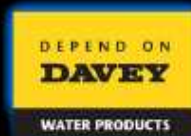

On March 12th an Engagement Party was held at the OTH Institute for Bradley Kirk and Angela Jacobs.

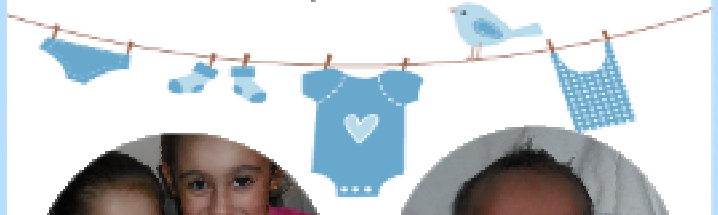
